# PROF. DR. RUKHSANA KAUSAR PRO VICE CHANCELLOR RLKU ATTENDS VICE CHANCELLOR'S CONFERENCE 2025, ORGANIZED BY HIGHER EDUCATION COMMISSION AT ISLAMABAD

The Higher Education Commission (HEC) of Pakistan convened a two-day Vice Chancellors' conference bringing together heads of universities and senior academic leaders from across the country to address the critical challenges and opportunities in the higher education sector. The sessions, spread over two days focused on policy alignment, academic reforms, employability, research excellence, digital transformation, and governance models to strengthen Pakistan's higher education system.

Representing Rashid Latif Khan University (RLKU), Emeritus Prof. Dr. Rukhsana Kausar, Pro Vice Chancellor, participated as an active voice as a panelist in a discussion on Themes "Employability of graduates and brain Drain and Harassment issues in the HEIs". She emphasized the urgent need for higher education institutions to address the twin challenges of graduate employability, and brain drain, aligning with the national vision of developing globally competitive yet locally committed graduates. She also highlighted RLKU's efforts in implementing skill-oriented education and fostering an environment that promotes innovation, research, and community engagement. She also emphasized the need of addressing issue of harassment in HEIs, through provision of enabling environment on campus, taking immediate measures to deal with harassment cases and to maintain strict confidentiality of such cases. Moreover, she highlighted the need for training of personnel involved in Anti-harassment committees to conduct proceedings in transparent and professional manner. Her participation in this high-level forum reflects RLKU's proactive engagement in national-level policy dialogues and underscores Prof. Dr. Kausar's commitment to shaping strategic reforms that can enhance the quality, accessibility, and impact of higher education in Pakistan.


### STUCON WORKSHOP ON 'PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT & INTERPERSONAL SKILLS'





#### Surviving Through Medical College: Mastering Stress and Building Resilience


